In 2020, we had stories of some special dogs who became tripods, but this year it seems it is the cats. Surprisingly, cats also do just fine on 3 legs, and it is sometimes the best option to save their lives and allow them to live pain-free. Thanks to our awesome partner vets and dedicated fosters who cared for these special cases, all will recover and be able to live their best lives with their adoptive families.

While these three were unique, we've also had our usual slew of kitties come through this year with various maladies: upper respiratory infections, eye infections, underweight, fleas, ringworm, parasite infections, etc.

Geo, a sweet dilute ginger kitty, started our year with his emergency leg amputation due to injuries and wounds that just would not heal despite everyone's best efforts.

## **Overlooked – Heartworm Positive Dogs**

Heartworm positive dogs in shelters are often passed over by many rescues due to low funds for medical treatment and lack of equipped fosters. As of the beginning of October 2021, BFPA has rescued and treated 19 heartworm positive dogs, with several more currently in various stages of treatment! Most of these dogs were very adoptable and had no other issues besides heartworms, but they were scheduled to be euthanized at the shelters due to no rescue interest.

The cost for treatment runs approximately \$250-\$350 per dog (based on weight), and involves foster commitment for approximately 8 total weeks, 4 of

which require the dog to be kept crated and/or extremely calm during recovery – which is no small task, especially for a bouncy little chap like Vinnie (right) who felt great during his treatment and recovery. We would like to thank our fosters and volunteers who make treating HW+ dogs possible – we save so many dogs by being able to provide

this life-saving treatment.

Remember: Heartworm disease is easily prevented with a monthly pill from your veterinarian!








### **Typical Veterinary Costs**
