BFPA's 25th year has been marked by growth and adaptation. We are grateful to have welcomed several new volunteers who have generously stepped in to assume critical roles on the Board and on our Dog Medical team. Moreover, our Cat Team has flourished this year, enabling us to showcase our feline friends at Petsmart (Cary) on a weekly basis. We also successfully ran our annual fundraisers for the third consecutive year, thanks to the dedication of volunteers who tirelessly manage these events year after year.

While it's been a year of notable achievements, we've also faced a number of challenges along the way. We lost several long-term volunteers who felt it was time to move on and end their tenure. Dog adoptions are down (~20%) and we've seen a dip in the number of people willing to foster, both trends that started emerging in 2022. In fact, we had to temporarily halt dog intake due to a shortage of volunteer resources. In addition, monetary donations continue to be impacted by inflation and rising costs affecting everyone.

However, we are resilient and remain committed to our mission, so your support is more crucial than ever. While monetary donations are essential, we need volunteers willing to play ongoing 'run the business' type roles, and as always, individuals willing to foster animals. Please consider contributing to BFPA in 2024 through donations, fundraising, or volunteering your time. Together, we can continue making a difference in the lives of animals in need.



This year, we welcomed 120 cats into our rescue, each with unique needs. While their basic requirements include spaying/neutering, vaccinations, and love from foster homes, some needed extra TLC. Race had a corneal adhesion removed from his eye to improve his quality of life, but of course he still can't have a driver's license! Callie found herself in a shelter that couldn't care for her due to an unknown tail injury, which necessitated its amputation. Sabrina suffered a broken leg when she fell from the cat tree, and this incident continues to puzzle us. In addition, we had a few very young kittens needing expensive formula and a very dedicated foster family to help them thrive. Each kitty's time in rescue can vary due to the various challenges they face, but they all have one thing in common: committed and loving foster homes and funding for their medical needs. Your generous donations make it possible to cover these expenses.

Puppy Paws

In September of this year, BFPA was alerted to a Momma dog, **Abby**, and her **six 4-week old puppies** who had been seized by animal control in Rockingham County. The shelter was desperate to get the family out of the shelter due to the age of the puppies and how susceptible they are to deadly illnesses such as parvovirus. Abby herself was in poor shape with a body scale rating of 2/9, scabs from flystrike on her ears, and an open wound that went approximately 3/4 of the way around her neck from a deeply embedded collar. To top it off, she was also heartworm postive! Thankfully, a BFPA volunteer stepped forward and was able to be both a medical and a triage foster for the entire family for 4 weeks until the puppies were old enough to get their first shots and go off to other foster homes. BFPA desperately needs more volunteers willing to open their homes to dogs like Abby who just need a little medical care, love, and good groceries while waiting for their forever homes!



Faithful Volunteers

BFPA is an all-volunteer organization, with no paid staff. Most of our volunteers work full-time jobs and generously contribute their spare time to our cause. Volunteerism has been declining in many nonprofits, and we've felt its impact. We not only lost our Director of Volunteers, but several of our long-term volunteers decided to move on after 5-10+ years of service. We are immensely **grateful** for the 25 years of support from dedicated individuals. We're especially **thankful** for those who responded to our call for help this summer, lightening the load for others. In Memoriam




